OCTOBER WORKSHOP ALL-HANDS RECAP

Tanya McGee, Region Lead Coordinator for Sound Generations, told us about Sound Generations' mission and what services they offer. She also had ideas on how NNN and they can work together to provide the best choices for NNN members.

Sound Generations sounds a lot like us. From their brochure: Sound Generations connects seniors and adults with disabilities with vital resources in their communities. We provide them with meals, drive them to essential services, ease the loneliness, and alleviate caregiver stress. We are committed to helping people thrive and feel included and respected.

With all that, one might ask: what is left for NNN to do? Tanya made it clear that there is not only room for the both of us, but that there is more need than all of us can fill together.



As volunteers for NNN, for our own needs, and as a source of knowledge for our neighbors, all of us should be aware of Sound Generations, what they offer, and how to get in touch with them. We heard a lot at the workshop, most of us had some *AHA!* moments. And probably all of us felt overwhelmed with information. Suzy Chandler and Eileen Carter talked about fall prevention. They provided us with a couple of handouts, one to use when checking your personal risk for falling, and a checklist for home safety. These lists are good for all of us, any age, any physical ability. They can also be used as we visit NNN members in their homes. While we should not present ourselves at the experts in fall prevention, we can work with one another to correct the more obvious dangers and know where to go for more help.
