In January and February, the NNN Board was finalizing a grant request for King County levy funding, and refining our goals for 2020 and beyond. Our biggest need right now is adding additional Board members!

In March, our lives changed with the reality of the quickly-spreading COVID-19



virus. We soon learned this new risk for our own friends and family is especially risky for Seniors—both the members we serve and our Senior volunteers. Following the Governor's Stay Home, Stay Healthy mandates and guidance from other Senior Villages across the nation, we made the difficult decision to limit many of our 1:1 in-person services. Phone calls, errands, gro-

cery delivery, and porch visits became the new norm.

As we move into the summer months and into less restrictive phases in our NNN Community in King and Snohomish Counties, we will continue to build on innovative ways to connect with our members and volunteers (are you ZOOMING with us yet?) as well as adding back some of our favorite walks and social gatherings which are a key part of connecting us and helping us live well in our own homes and communities.

What have our volunteers been up to in helping our members in 2020? Despite COVID-19 social distancing challenges to keep safe and healthy at home, we've been busy helping where possible, with a big jump in May.

Service hours (not including one-to-one phone chats and walking buddies, or Zooms, or our behind-the scenes administrative work, which equaled more than one full-time position):


ALL-HANDS RECAP

Being welcome, sharing ideas, making connections...


That's what it means for so many of us who volunteer and/or are members of Northwest Neighbors Network.

- 3. Guide to Tracking Visits (including any follow-up needed)









HOT NEWS—NNN RECEIVES KING COUNTY GRANT AWARD

In a very competitive field of entrants, we are excited to share that NNN was one of eight groups selected to receive funding from the King County Veterans, Seniors and Human Services Levy (VSHSL) to help support the

launch of Senior Virtual Villages like our NNN model. What does this mean for NNN? We're going to focus on programs, connections with local agencies, and best methods to help us serve Seniors in the Shoreline and Lake Forest Park areas. Of course NNN will continue to grow in our Snohomish County communities, but this funding will allow us to launch even more effectively in the northern-most area of King County where many Seniors struggle to get the support they need to age well in their own homes without help.
